<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Represent CLCID members and Interior Designers in California related to legislative and regulatory issues that directly affect the Interior Design profession • Develop and monitor legislation and regulations relating to Interior Design professionalism, standards and scope of practice • Monitor the effectiveness of the Business and Professions Codes on Interior Design and the certification board overseeing Interior Design certification • Maintain industry recognition • Interact and collaborate with architects, contractors, building officials, fire code officials, legislators, government officials, safety and health-related organizations, and building code-related organizations regarding issues that directly affect the Interior Design profession • Compile and distribute pertinent information to CLCID members • Educate on issues that protect the Interior Designer's right to practice in the state of CA • Engage CLCID members in legislative and regulatory processes and issues • Fund legislative activities that the CLCID Board of Directors elects to pursue • Collect funding from members, allies and industry • Represent CIDs to consumers, fire code officials, building officials and architects • Promote the professionalism of interior designers • Monitor activities and compliance of CCIDC • Monitor groups that affect professional criteria of Interior Design 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Comply with the California Business and Professions Codes on Interior Design • Qualify and certify Interior Designers (CIDs) in CA • CCIDC can designate examinations required to qualify for certification • Maintain certification of CID's • Educate CIDs on how to present and promote their certification status • Market to the Interior Design professionals and students to initiate interest and participation in the Interior Design certification program • Develop, update and administer CCRE testing • Monitor and evaluate CID CEU compliance • Ensure consumer protection through examination and certification • Monitor consumer and/or professional complaints related to CIDs • Legislative activities related to CCIDC's sunset review process only • Ensure CIDs follow code of ethics • No promoting of existing interior designers • Education and charitable related issues • Outreach and educate consumers
